October 15 to November 14, 2020

Jeremiah 33: 3 “Call to me and I will answer you and tell you great and unsearchable things you do not know.”

October 15 – Johannesburg, South Africa

Herman Roodt, the head of the Harvesters Ministries Training Department, is currently training a group of HLT's (Harvesters Licensed Trainers). They will be completing their Phase C HLT training. All of the training is taking place via an online platform. We praise the Lord for technology. Pray that the training will be successful.

October 16 – Antananarivo, Madagascar

Pastor Alain Moreno is presenting Phase D training for the next few days. By the grace of God, 110 Malagasy Bibles will be distributed at this training. Pray that the Word of God will change communities in Madagascar.

October 17 – Mboza, South Africa

Danie and Erika Pelsler, along with Hannes Enslin, trained church leaders in an informal settlement in Mboza for the past few days. The training was mainly focused on the new Harvesters Ministries App. Pray that this training will be fruitful and that everyone who attended will reach the unreached with the Gospel.

October 18 – Amazon

Harvesters Ministries is visiting the Amazon Region for the next seven days. Manaus, Eirunepé, Tefé and Santo Antônio do Içá will be visited. Pray that the Holy Spirit will conduct these meetings so that people can truly connect with the vision of Harvesters. Pray that they will embrace Evangelism, Discipleship and Church planting with all their hearts.

October 19 – Andhra Pradesh, India

Please keep Harvesters Ministries' Church leader from Andhra Pradesh, Raul*, in your prayers today. He is experiencing serious cardiac health issues. Pray for healing and strength during this difficult time. (*Not his real name.)

October 20 – China

A group of faithful brothers and sisters have started to resume with Pastoral and Discipleship training in China. Please pray for them and Brother T as they travel to different cities to share the Gospel with the lost, make disciples and plant churches.

October 21 – Middle East

Pray for Harvesters Ministries partners in the region and ask the Lord that their light will shine brightly. Pray that God will

use the refugee crisis in the Middle East to draw people closer to Him. Pray that people will seek God in the midst of this crisis.

October 22 – Ethiopia

Please keep Harvesters Ministries Country leader, Getahun Tadesse, in your prayers today. Pray for our 180 church leaders and their families. They are going through extremely difficult times. Pray that the Lord will open the right doors for these church leaders to expand the ministry into Eritrea and Somalia.

October 23 – Harvesters Ministries, COVID-19 Hunger Response

Pray that the local church in different countries will continue to evangelize the lost. Pray that they will be carriers of hope. Trust the Lord for enough funding to assist church leaders with food and necessities to help those around them. Trust that church planting will continue.

October 24 – Tanzania

Keep Jesse Msonsa, Harvesters Ministries Country leader for Tanzania, in your prayers today. Ask the Lord to grant him the necessary wisdom to find a way to help the thousands in his country who are suffering. Many people are in crisis and face daily challenges.

October 25 – Uttar Pradesh, India

Pray for God's guidance, help and opportunities to serve Him with new commitment. Pray that people will not get depressed but will find peace in God during this global pandemic. Ask the Lord to heal those who are ill. Pray that people who are suffering due to demonic oppression will be delivered.

October 26 – Iran

Pray that our many underground brothers and sisters in Iran will respond with wisdom. Pray that they will know the peace of God that surpasses all understanding.

October 27 – Haiti

Haiti is a fragile nation where the majority of the population live on less than \$2 per day. Recently there has been an increase in gang-related killings. Many innocent children were killed in their neighborhoods. Please keep this nation in your prayers today.

October 28 – Malawi

Harvesters Ministries has three Country leaders in Malawi – Pastors Medson, Isaac and Anthony. Please keep them in your prayers today. Thousands in their country are suffering due to the COVID-19 pandemic. They are facing many daily struggles. Ask the Lord to carry them through each day.

October 29 – Middle East

Let's pray for the political leaders and as well as the media that they will exercise restraint. Pray that they will make every effort to prevent war and do what they can to protect the innocent in their countries.

October 30 – Cabo Delgado, Mozambique

There is a lack of access to clean water and sanitation facilities. The floods and heavy rains have led to a cholera outbreak, with over 1,200 cases and 18 deaths reported already. Severe food insecurity has risen due to the combination of Cyclone Kenneth, floods and violence. Pray that the Lord will show Harvesters how to make a difference and support them. Also keep Harvesters Ministries' Country leaders, Armindo Magule and Marcos Binda in your prayers.

October 31 – Kenya

As a missions' organization it is important for us to support other organizations who experience difficulty during this pandemic. Pray that the work that Barry and his team were doing among the Maasai people of Kenya will be able to resume soon.

November 1 – Zambia

Church leaders in Zambia need your prayers. They are reaching the lost with the Gospel despite their own severe poverty. Continue to pray that the Luvale people will be reached with the Gospel. Trust the Lord that His Kingdom will continue to expand in Zambia.

November 2 – Uttarakhand, India

The construction of churches in three different cities had to be stopped due to the COVID-19 lockdown. More than 30 baptisms were delayed due to travel restrictions in the country. Pray that the Lord will keep church leaders in India motivated.

November 3 – Uganda

Harvesters Ministries Country leader, Charles Mukuhwana, really needs you to intercede for him today. Most of our church leaders are going through extreme challenges due to the COVID-19 lockdown. Their income has decreased drastically and many of them are facing possible starvation. Ask the Lord to help these brothers and sisters.

November 4 – Mongolia

Church leaders in this precious nation really need your prayers. The majority of the people in the rural parts of Mongolia live a nomadic lifestyle. It is extremely difficult to reach the lost and make disciples in this vast landscape. Despite this, church leaders are persevering and sharing the Gospel.

November 5 – Mboza, South Africa

Pastor Jabulani and a group of church leaders will receive training in Discipleship and Evangelism over the next couple of days. Please keep this group of church leaders in your prayers today. Pray that God will use them to build His Kingdom.

November 6 – Cabo Delgado, Mozambique

The situation in Cabo Delgado province, Mozambique, has deteriorated rapidly due to insecurity and violence. At least 195 violent incidents were reported since the beginning of the year. 250,000 People are now living as refugees. Pray for each

person that has been affected. Trust that the Lord will use this situation for His glory.

November 7 – Nairobi, Kenya

Please keep our Country leader, Dylan Agoye, in your prayers today. There are thousands of people experiencing an immense crisis at the moment. These people face many daily struggles. Intercede for those who are suffering in Kenya. Ask the Lord to grant Dylan the necessary wisdom and strength to support those in need.

November 8 – Andhra Pradesh, India

Church leaders' evangelism efforts have been temporarily called off due to travel restrictions. Pastors are not allowed to leave their homes. Many positive cases have been reported in the area. Please pray for God's protection. Pray for all the new converts in the area. All the church leaders have been calling them and encouraging them to stand firm in their newfound faith.

November 9 – Somalia

There were terrible clashes between civilians and al-Shabab fighters. Dozens of people were killed. Please continue to keep this country in your prayers. Believers in Somalia continue to face terrible persecution and live in fear. Pray that God will give the strength to stand strong against these attacks.

November 10 – Harvesters Ministries Training Department

Herman Roodt, the head of the Harvesters Ministries Training Department, is training a group of HLT's (Harvesters Licensed Trainers) from all over South Africa and the United States of America for the next three days. All of the training is taking place via an online platform. We praise the Lord for technology. Pray that the training will be successful.

November 11 – Brazil

Please keep Brazil in your prayers today. The Coronavirus is causing havoc and has infected millions of Brazilians. Church leaders cannot reach their congregations to support them. Pray that God will strengthen church leaders and believers in Brazil.

November 12 – Cameroon

A spate of deadly attacks in the far north of Cameroon are leaving people fearful. Women and children are mainly targeted in these attacks. People are too scared to tend to their fields. More than 2,000 internally displaced people had to change their daily routines to ensure their safety. Pray that God's Kingdom will grow in this nation.

November 13 – Uttar Pradesh, India

Pray for God's protection over church leaders. Pray that families may have a deeper understanding of God and experience renewed unity. Trust the Lord for His faithfulness in meeting the daily needs of church leaders, believers and their families.

November 14 – Middle East

Intercede with us today. Pray that we will be able to travel again soon to continue our training and partnerships in the Middle East. Many church leaders are suffering and are in dire need of our support. 🙏
